
2023 Participation







"How do you plan to incorporate the new information into your work?"

- Utilize trauma informed language in community engagement, outreach and with clients
- Share learnings with fellow commissioners to support County-wide change
- Consult with leadership around our gender-affirming care efforts
- Make service/program improvements to be more inclusive
- Educate patients on resources including mandated reports to DCFS
- Ensure data collection tools and forms reflect multiple identities
- Integrate education on healthy relationships with youth clients
- Start initiating partnership development
- Integrate self care activities with clients and staff
- Integrate universal education to ask all caregivers about IPV to better support children
- Engage in more training
- Be more nonjudgmental in my conversations
